CRAFTING CONFETTI BOOKMARKS WITH SELLOTAPE

INSTRUCTIONS

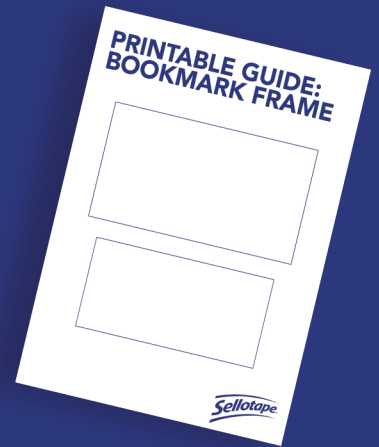
STEP 2

Trace the outline of the larger cut-out on a piece of cardboard. Put this cut-out aside, place the smaller cut-out on the centre of the cardboard, and trace again. Repeat this tracing process on a second piece of cardboard, and carefully cut out both traced shapes to create two identical cardboard frames.

Disclaimer: Make sure that this step is completed with the supervision of an adult.

STEP 1

Carefully cut out the two shapes provided to start creating the bookmark frame.



FUN FACT

Did you know that Sellotape has introduced a plant-based tape with 0% plastic?

STEP 3

Stick the 2 pieces of cardboard together using Pritt, and paint or colour the shape using your creativity! If painted, wait until dry.



STEP 4

Now start taping Sellotape onto the cardboard frame to begin creating the bookmark interior. With the sticky part facing down, stick the Sellotape onto the cardboard, and repeat until the whole interior is covered top to bottom.



STEP 5

Fold the tissue paper in half and cut out semi-circles along the fold to create the confetti.



STEP 6

Turn the bookmark around and sprinkle/stick your confetti onto the Sellotape, covering it entirely. Your bookmark is now finished!
